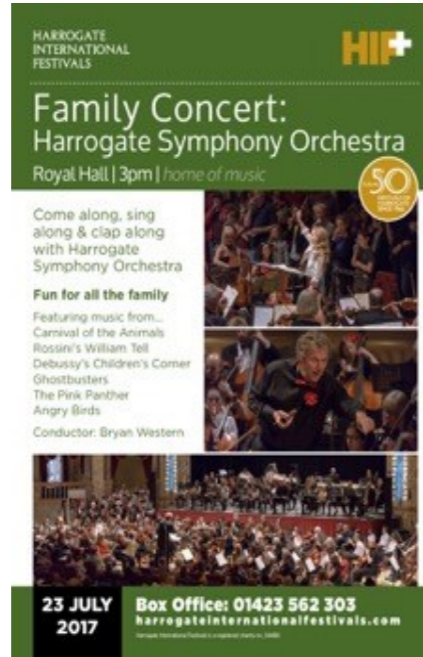
SPORTS CLUB
